

## Short bio

George Lueddeke PhD MEd Dipl.AVES (Hon) is an educational advisor in higher and medical education and chairs the global One Health Education Task Force for the One Health Commission (OHC) and the One Health Initiative (OHI). Originally from Canada he has worked in both northern and southern communities as a teacher, educational manager and developer, and as a program consultant across a wide range of disciplines/professions. Residing in the United Kingdom, he has held posts in higher education as founding director of education development at Bradford University and in medical education at Southampton University's Faculty of Medicine, receiving the Chancellor Education Excellence Award. As an advisor he has collaborated *inter alia* with the Kent, Surrey and Sussex (KSS) Postgraduate Deanery in London, the UK Centre for Workforce Intelligence, the UK Care Quality Commission, the Association of Schools of Public Health in the European Region, the Commonwealth Secretariat, the InterAction Council, to name several organisations.

Dr Lueddeke has published widely on educational transformation, innovation and leadership. Recent articles have focused, among others, on climate change (*PLOS-2018*), migration (*Africa Health News-2017*), One Health & SDGs (*World Medical Education Journal-2016*). Books include *Transforming Medical Education for the 21st Century: Megatrends, Priorities and Change* (CRC, 2012), *Global Population Health and Well-Being for the 21st Century: Toward New Paradigms, Policy and Practice* (Springer, 2016) and *Survival: One Health, One Planet, One Future*, (Routledge, 2019). *Survival* is meant to raise awareness of and stimulate discussion on today's global issues to help translate the One Health & Well-Being concept alongside the UN-2030 Global Goals into meaningful action on the ground.

Invited as a plenary speaker to different corners of the world, he has presented sessions for such organisations as the UK General Medical Council, the American Medical Association, University 21 (U21) Health Sciences Group (Millennium Goals- Ireland), the Public Health Association of South Africa, University of Sri Lanka Jayewardenepura Medical School, Faculty of Public Health (United Kingdom), The Catharina Pijls Lecture on Global and European Health (Annual Maastricht Symposium), the Global Health Council (USA), Vet Med and Med Schools - Cambridge University, the UK Veterinary Public Health Association, the World Veterinary Association and the World Medical Association (Kitakyushi, Japan), the Arab Health Congress (Dubai), the International Schools Association annual Youth Leadership Encounter Conference on Worldwide Migration and London King's College (United Kingdom).

He is presently leading the *International One Health for One Planet Education Initiative* (1 HOPE) for the OHC/OHI involving over 40 nations from six global regions. Most recently, he was awarded the American Veterinary Epidemiology Society (AVES) Honorary Diploma for 2019.
